## Investment Strategy

The Berenberg Global Dividend Champions pursues a global bottom-up approach with a focus on quality stocks characterised by healthy earnings growth and solid balance sheets. This is the basis for stable distributions with above-average dividend growth. The fund is suitable for investors who want regular distributions and want to participate in the growth opportunities on the equity market.

- Global investment strategy focussing on quality income: growth and regular distributions
- Long-term investment horizon and therefore low portfolio turnover
- All cap approach, i.e. utilisation of investment opportunities across all market segments
- Stability even in uncertain market situations

## Fund management comment

In December, global equity markets trended positive, driven by easing interest rate concerns and growing expectations of monetary policy easing in the US. US equities proved more robust than their European counterparts, while emerging markets helped stabilize global equity performance with largely solid returns. The Berenberg Global Dividend Champions outperformed its benchmark in the reporting month. Positive contributions came from European banks ING and UniCredit, which benefited from positive analyst outlooks, and from Smurfit Westrock, which showed signs of recovery. Detractors included Broadcom, NextEra Energy, and Eaton. Broadcom suffered from concerns about AI investments and high valuations, while NextEra and Eaton declined amid profit-taking.

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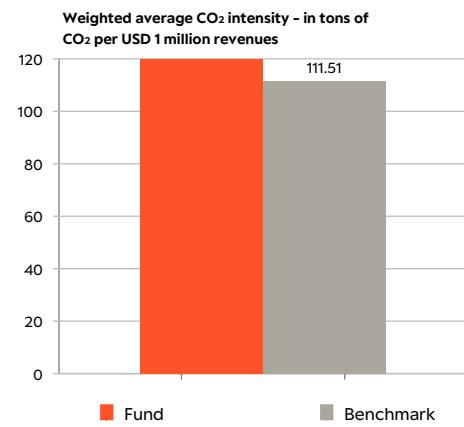

## Consideration of ESG Elements

Identifying companies and business models that will be successful in the long term is the basis for good investment decisions. Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) factors are key factors in decision making and are therefore integral components of the investment process.

### CO<sub>2</sub> Intensity

The fund does not actively manage its carbon footprint, however, emissions data such as CO<sub>2</sub> intensity are relevant parameters which can be used to assess the efficient management of a company and the extent of transition risks.



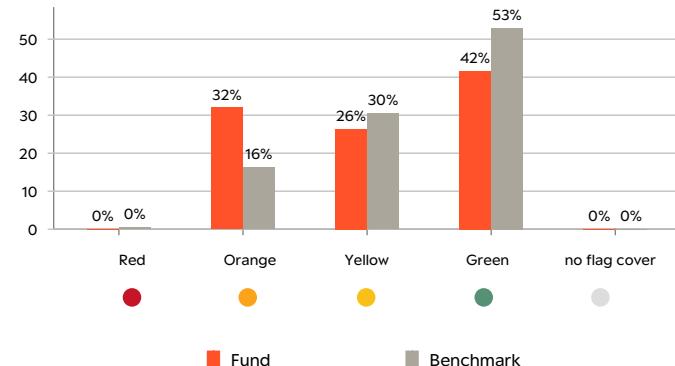
### ESG Score

The data provider MSCI ESG uses an ESG score of 0 to 10 to assess the management of material ESG risks of portfolio holdings compared to competitors.



### ESG Controversies Screen

Investments in the fund are monitored for ESG controversies and, with the help of MSCI ESG data, flagged according their severity. Thereby, potential ESG risks of investments are identified. In the case of an orange flag (severe controversy), we enter into an active exchange with the company. In the case of a red flag (very severe controversy), the company is excluded.

## Glossary & Methodology

### Active Ownership

The term "Active Ownership" encompasses all our activities where we, as an investor, attempt to positively influence a company's management of ESG aspects. This includes Engagement, i.e. direct dialogue with companies to discuss specific ESG objectives as well as proxy voting, i.e. our voting recommendations to our fund administrator, which then exercises the voting rights at general meetings.

### CO<sub>2</sub> Intensity

The CO<sub>2</sub> Intensity (Scope 1 & 2 emissions) per company is multiplied by its portfolio weight (current value of the investment by current portfolio value) and summed up. This weighted average CO<sub>2</sub> Intensity provides an indication of the portfolio's exposure to CO<sub>2</sub>-emission intensive companies.

### ESG Score

Using a score between 0 (lowest) and 10 (highest), MSCI ESG assesses the ability of portfolio holdings to identify and manage environmental, social and governance-related risks compared to peers. The ESG scores are assigned at the holding level and are aggregated at the portfolio level as the weighted average ESG Score.

### ESG Controversies Screen

MSCI ESG analyses controversial business practices from the five areas environment, human rights, labour rights & supply management, customers and governance. The controversies are rated according to their reputational risk as well as the operational handling by a flagging system. Green indicates no or weak controversies, yellow indicates moderate controversies, orange indicates severe controversies and red indicates very severe controversies.
